GOSPEL

John 6:1-15

Jesus went off to the other side of the Sea of Galilee – or of Tiberias – and a large crowd followed him, impressed by the signs he gave by curing the sick. Jesus climbed the hillside, and sat down there with his disciples. It was shortly before the Jewish feast of Passover.

Looking up, Jesus saw the crowds approaching and said to Philip, 'Where can we buy some bread for these people to eat?' He only said this to test Philip; he himself knew exactly what he was going to do. Philip answered, 'Two hundred denarii would only buy enough to give them a small piece each.' One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said, 'There is a small boy here with five barley loaves and two fish; but what is that between so many?' Jesus said to them, 'Make the people sit down.' There was plenty of grass there, and as many as five thousand men sat down. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and gave them out to all who were sitting ready; he then did the same with the fish, giving out as much as was wanted. When they had eaten enough he said to the disciples, 'Pick up the pieces left over, so that nothing gets wasted.' So they picked them up, and filled twelve hampers with scraps left over from the meal of five barley loaves. The people, seeing this sign that he had given, said, 'This really is the prophet who is to come into the world.' Jesus, who could see they were about to come and take him by force and make him king, escaped back to the hills by himself.

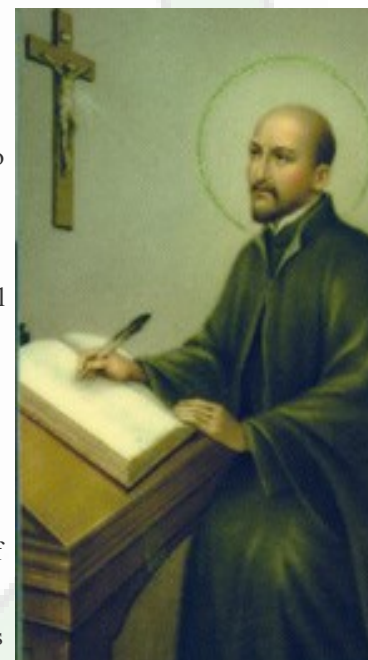

St Ignatius Of Loyola– Feast Day 31st July

Born Inigo Lopez de Loyola in 1491, the man known as Ignatius of Loyola entered the world in Loiola, Spain. Inigo was the youngest of thirteen children. His mother died when he was just seven, and he was then raised by Maria de Garin, who was the wife of a blacksmith. His last name, "Loyola" was taken from the village of his birth.
 He was a soldier in the Spanish Army in wars against the French. He was injured and while recovering from surgery, he underwent a profound spiritual conversion and discerned a call to the religious life. In 1522 he travelled to the Benedictine monastery of Montserrat where he left his sword on the altar of Mary in dedication to her.
 He spent the next eleven years studying at Alcala, Salamanca and Paris. Along with companions, including Francis Xavier, he took vows of poverty and chastity with the hope of doing missionary pilgrimages to the Holy Land. In 1537 they travelled to Italy to be ordained.
 Pope Paul III officially recognized their society, the Society of Jesus (known today as the Jesuits) in 1540. Ignatius wrote the Jesuit Constitutions and spent the rest of his life working for the Society, caring for the sick and the poor, founding colleges and universities to educate the clergy as well as the laity. He died in Rome at the age of 65years.
